A message from the Executive Director and the Board President

In 2010 the numbers tell the story...

Food Share of Lincoln County numbers reflect a year of service achievement and add up to tell the story of people helping people.

- Over 900,000 pounds of food were distributed
- 35,427 individuals representing 13,976 families received emergency food (these numbers are not unduplicated).
- Monthly, 25 special boxes were delivered to seniors with mobility & health barriers
- For every \$1.00 donated, 5 pounds of food was distributed
- 12,766 annual volunteer hours, saved Food Share \$195,360 in labor costs
- We compiled, printed and distributed 750 Lincoln County Services Guide highlighting available local resources.

For 28 years, Food Share of Lincoln County has led community efforts in awareness and elimination of hunger in Lincoln County. Through ever increasing community outreach and partnerships, we strive to provide service to our clients and our county. This annual report provides an overview or the current state of Food Share of Lincoln County.

Supplemental Agencies

Food Share of Lincoln County distributes emergency food boxes through six affiliated pantries located in Lincoln City, Depoe Bay, Newport, Waldport, Siletz and Toledo. We also collaborate with Coastal Range Food Bank in Nashville Oregon.

In addition to the pantries, we provide assistance in the form of food, and other donated items to seven agencies. Our support helps to stretch agency budgets, which means more dollars can be used for direct service to clients.

Calvary Baptist Church provides a free hot meal to all comers 2 days per week. The church provides the cooking and eating facilities; Food Share provides the majority of the food. The kitchen serves an average of 74 meals per week.

St. Stephen's Episcopal Church (Stone Soup Supper) hosts a Monday night collaborative hot meal program with other churches in Newport. The kitchen serves an average of 44 meals per week.

Olalla Center for Children is an intensive day treatment center for emotionally disturbed children and their families. During the school year we provide the center with healthy snacks.

Trueman Recovery Center is a state certified alcohol and drug recovery agency. We provide snack food, bread, and staples as our food supply allows.

South Lincoln Resources, a helping agency for south county residents, receives food for their holiday baskets.

Operation Snack Packs and East County Backpack Program receives food from Food Share to help fill backpacks for children to take home on weekends and no-school days.

Food Share Programs & Services

The Emergency Food Assistance Program is the largest direct distribution program at Food Share.

- Six pantries
- 2950 people served monthly
- 61,000 pounds of food distributed monthly

Senior boxes provide food to seniors whose mobility or health issues prevent them from accessing an emergency box at their local pantry.

- 30 boxes delivered monthly by Meals on Wheel
- Special easy prepare and single serve foods

Holiday Giving

- A collaboration with the local Salvation Army
- Special food baskets and gifts are distributed
- FFA from Perrydale School provides a truckload of produce
- Senior gifts & boxes delivered through Meals on Wheels
